Outline of the Project

The ultimate ambition of the paper is to explore whether EU can be the new international aviation hegemon by initiating the multilateralism through its effort to negotiate, contract as well as sustainably adjust the Open Skies Agreement with ASEAN based on the externalization of EU's Normative Power Europe. 2017 is the 40th Anniversary of EU-ASEAN relations, more importantly, EU has officially announced that EU will conclude the EU-ASEAN Open Skies Agreement in 2017 to mark the celebration of 40-years relations between two parties.

The Conceptual Framework has been established based on the Regimes Theory research findings of Krasner, Ikenberry, Keohane, Nye, Stein, Powell as well as the Chicago Convention and other international civil aviation laws and regulations. Therefore, the field research should be conducted in ASEAN to explore whether ASEAN Secretariat and major ASEAN member states are willing to sign the Open Skies Agreement with EU.
